IVOR K. GOODRICH OBITUARY

Ivor Goodrich passed away in Moses Lake on May 24, 2005. He was 72 years old.

Born in Vernal, Utah he moved with his family to Moses Lake in 1944.

Ivor attended <u>WASHINGTON</u> State University through the ROTC program and graduated in 1955. He went directly into the Air Force after college graduation. He entered flight training school and became a fighter pilot. He received his masters degree from George <u>WASHINGTON</u> University in 1967, and in 1968 served a tour of duty in Vietnam flying 118 combat missions. He was awarded the Distinguished <u>Flying</u> Cross for heroism and extraordinary achievement while participating in aerial combat. He attended the Canadian War <u>College</u>, and was part of the instructor staff of the <u>Joint</u> Forces <u>Staff College</u> in Norfolk, Va.

After 20 years of service, he retired as a Lt. Col and then moved into his second career: the development of <u>Pelican</u> Point residential community and aviation instruction at Big Bend Community <u>College</u>.

He is survived by his wife <u>Pat</u> of 49 years, his two daughters Joni <u>Schur</u> and husband Robert, Donna <u>Sanders</u> and husband George, his son Scott <u>Goodrich</u> and wife Becky. He is survived by his five grandchildren: Katie, <u>Shelby</u>, Brandon, Heather and <u>Whitney</u>. He was preceded in death by his parents, Karl and Peggy <u>Goodrich</u>, and is survived by his brother <u>Huck Goodrich</u> as well as a niece, nephews and cousins.

Ivor will be remembered for his service to our country, his love of aviation and will be dearly missed by his family and friends.

A memorial service to celebrate Ivor's life will be held on Friday, June 3, at 11 a.m. at the First Presbyterian church of <u>Moses</u> Lake, 1142 West <u>Ivy</u> Avenue.
